**What are the Sufi orders in Bosnia?** Among these, the most influential were the Naqshbandi and the Halveti; others included the Bektashi, Halveti, Qadiri, Mawlawi, Tabani and Rifaiyah orders.

**What were the biggest Sufi orders?** All these orders were founded by a major Islamic scholar, and some of the largest and most widespread included the Suhrawardiyya (after Abu al-Najib Suhrawardi [d. 1168]), Qadiriyya (after Abdul-Qadir Gilani [d. 1166]), the Rifa'iyya (after Ahmed al-Rifa'i [d.

**What were the orders of Sufis called?** The sufi orders were called Silsilas.

**What are the Sufi orders in the Balkans?** The Sufis of the Ottoman Balkans significantly strengthened the development of Islam. Sufi influence is still felt in the overall appearance of Balkan Islam. The most numerous and widespread tariqas (Sufi orders) during Ottoman rule in the Balkans were the Khalwatiyyah and Bektashiyyah orders.

**Are Sufi orders Sunni or Shia?** Sufism is more prominent among Sunnis, but there are also Shiite Sufi orders, or "tariqa." Followers of Sufism believe they can become closer to Allah through inner purification and introspection. They do this by meditating and receiving guidance from their spiritual leaders, or "murshid" (guide).

**Which countries have the most Sufis?** India, it is claimed, is one of the five great centers of Sufism, the other four being Persia (including central Asia), Baghdad, Syria, and North Africa.

**What are the 4 types of Sufis?**

**What does the Quran say about Sufism?** The words in 48:10 are clearly taken out of context. These words do not speak about allegiance to any Sufi sheikh, but in this verse God is addressing prophet Muhammad regarding those who pledged their allegiance to him during one of the battles. The words that follow in verses 11 and 12 confirm this matter.

**How is Sufism different from Islam?** Sufism is the esoteric aspect of Islam. The aim of Sufis is to gain direct knowledge of the eternal, in this life, as opposed to the exoteric, or traditionalist, aspect of Islam which focuses on achieving a state of blessedness after death by way of carrying out divinely

prescribed works.

### **Who is the most famous Sufi?**

**What percentage of Muslims are Sufi?** Although it may seem the case, Sufism actually has many devotees, and followers are estimated to number around 300 million out of a worldwide 1.6 billion Muslims, thus accounting for close to 19 percent of the Sunni branch of Islam.

**What is the most important belief in Sufism?** The main belief of Sufism is that unification with Allah is the most important goal of an individual's life. Sufis believe that mysticism and its methods are the best way to achieve that.

**What is the biggest Sufi order?** Qadiriyya - Probably the biggest Sufi order. It was founded by Ghous ul Azam Abdul Qadir Gilani (Rah) and can be found around the world. Naqshbandiyya - A very popular Sufi order.

**What does Hu mean in Sufism?** Hu or Huwa (Arabic: هُوَ meaning "He") is a personal name for God in Sufism. Literally, Hebrew, Aramaic, and Arabic for the English third person and its variation as "Hu" is used in Sufism to avoid attribution of a gender to God (allah).

**What Sufi orders in Turkey?** The Khalwati order (also known as Khalwatiyya, Khalwatiya, or Halveti, as it is known in Turkey) is an Islamic Sufi brotherhood (tariqa). Along with the Naqshbandi, Qadiri, and Shadhili orders, it is among the most famous Sufi orders.

**Do Sufis drink alcohol?** The ecstasy of Sufi is a condition a Sufi reaches through inner transformation, a kind of fermentation experience they need to be able to drink, that is to assimilate. Wine that is forbidden for the sober, is allowed for the drunk dervish.

**What are the criticisms of Sufism?** Another criticism against Sufis is that they go to the shrines of Sheikhs and close servants of Allah, they make them the means to Allah and consider it goodness and blessings. While they believe it is associating a partner with Allah.

**Do Sufis follow Sharia?** Ascetic Sufism aka sober Sufism or Fundamentalist Sufism which follows a strict code of Sharia in its literal or apparent form including its sociopolitical elements. For them we are here on earth to only worship.

**Who brought Sufism to America?** West African Muslims were the first to practice Sufism in the Americas, attempting to maintain Sufi-Islamic traditions under the oppressive conditions of 17th-century plantation slavery.

**Who is the father of Sufism?** Hazrat Ali (A.S.) as The Father of Sufism According to Hazrat Ali Hajveri (Data Ganj Baksh) Radi Allahu anhu, the rank of Hazrat Ali (A.S.) is very high in the line up of Sufism. According to Hazrat Junaid Baghdadi Radi Allahu anhu, Hazrat Ali (A.S.) is the Shaikh as regards the principles and practices of Sufism.

**Are most Somalis Sufis?** Most Somalis today are at least nominal members of a Sufi order and members of the same Sufi order may come from opposing—even warring—clans. Devout members often gather together in residential communities around their sheikh known as jamaat (sing. jamaa').

**Do Sufis eat meat?** Sufism has a deep-rooted belief that vegetarianism is an essential step towards spiritual growth. A simple statement from a friend when discussed our common love for animals, 'If you love animals then why do you eat them?'

**Which saints belong to Sufism?** Since the first Muslim hagiographies were written during the period when Sufism began its rapid expansion, many of the figures who later came to be regarded as the



major saints in Sunni Islam were the early Sufi mystics, like Hasan of Basra, Farqad Sabakhi, Dawud Ta, Rabi'a al-'Adawiyya, Maruf Karkhi, and Junayd of ...

**Do Sufis pray 5 times a day?** A key term in the Sufi tradition is the Arabic term, dhikr, or remembrance or reminder of God. The Qur'an tells us about human forgetfulness, enjoining us to remember God, our mortality and judgment day. Dhikr for Sufis functions as a meditative practice and the Qur'an connects dhikr to ritual prayer five times a day.

**What is the Mevlevi order in Bosnia?** The Mevlevi are also known as the "whirling dervishes" due to their famous practice of whirling while performing dhikr (remembrance of God). Dervish is a common term for an initiate of the Sufi path; whirling is part of the formal sema ceremony and the participants are properly known as semazens.

on screen. Avoid white, bright red and all-black outfits.

**What do actors use to audition?** In most cases, a casting director will specifically request that you send in a self-tape. They'll do so after viewing the demo reel, headshot, and r sum  submitted by either you or your agent or manager.

**What not to wear for a video audition?** Practical Considerations for Audition Clothes While you don't need a costume designer, you'll want to stay away from overly loud and busy patterns, or colors that are tricky on camera, such as red. For example, if your backdrop is blue, you may want to stay away from blue tones that will make you blend in.

**What is considered plant growth?** Plant growth is defined as the increase in size by cell production and enlargement. Apical meristems at the tips of stems are responsible for primary growth to increase stem length and for the production of initials for the lateral appendages to the stem.

**What is the process of plant growth called?** Once the embryo germinates from its seed or parent plant, it begins to produce additional organs (leaves, stems, and roots) through the process of organogenesis. New roots grow from root meristems located at the tip of the root, and new stems and leaves grow from shoot meristems located at the tip of the shoot.

**What is an example of plant growth?** Seed germination is an important example of growth in plants where a seed germinates into a seedling, and the new seedling develops into an adult plant through the process of growth.

**What are the 4 requirements for plant growth?** All plants need space to grow, the right temperature, light, water, air, nutrients, and time.

**What are the signs of plant growth?** The development of strong stems and plenty of green leaves characterizes the vegetative stage of plant growth. These processes are critical because photosynthesis relies on sufficient leaf surface area to absorb light. Notably, healthy leaf development usually follows strong root growth.

**What are the three phases of growth in plants?** Phases of Growth in Plants There are three phases of growth – meristematic, elongation and maturation. We can understand this better by looking at a seed. We already know that the tips of roots and shoots exhibit continuous growth and hence are meristematic.

**What is the growth of a plant?** Plant growth could be defined as the increasing of plant volume and/or mass with or without formation of new structures such as organs, tissues, cells or cell organelles. Growth is usually associated with development (cell and tissue specialization) and reproduction (production of new individuals).

**What is primary growth in botany?** Primary growth in plants is growth that takes place from the tips of roots or shoots. It leads to lengthening of roots and stems and sets the stage for organ formation. It is distinguished from secondary growth that leads to widening. Plant growth takes place in well defined plant locations.

**What is a plant growth movement called?** Geotropism is growth movement by a plant in response to gravity (e.g. most of the roots grow downwards). Chemotropism is the growth movement of plants, in response to a chemical substance. ( e.g. movement of pollen tubes towards ovary).

**What is the science behind plant growth?** In plants, the cells are like millions and millions of tiny compartments stuck together, like Legos. When plants have the right balance of water, air, sunlight and nutrients, their cells grow and divide, and the whole plant gets bigger and bigger. And that's how plants grow.

**What makes leaves grow bigger?** An increase in leaf area can be due to the production of an enlarged primordium during the initiation at the meristem and/or to a progressive increase in size resulting from a faster and/or a prolonged growth period.

**How Brexit could affect UK banking sector?** UK banks holding branches in the EU may have to convert those entities to subsidiaries, a costly process, in order to continue providing financial services. As the UK becomes a third country, there may be a need to repaper contracts to reflect the UK's new legal status.

**How does the monetary policy work in the Bank of England?** As the UK's central bank, we use two main monetary policy tools. First, we set the interest rate we charge banks to borrow money from us – this is Bank Rate. Second, we can create money digitally to buy government and corporate bonds – this is known as asset purchase or quantitative easing (QE).

**What is the Bank of England monetary policy expectations?** The Bank of England's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) sets monetary policy to meet the 2% inflation target, and in a way that helps to sustain growth and employment. At its meeting ending on 19 June 2024, the MPC voted by a majority of 7–2 to maintain Bank Rate at 5.25%.

**What is the Monetary Policy Committee decision on the Bank of England?** At its meeting ending on 31 July 2024, the MPC voted by a majority of 5–4 to reduce Bank Rate by 0.25 percentage points, to 5%. Four members preferred to maintain Bank Rate at 5.25%. The Committee has published an

updated set of projections for activity and inflation in the accompanying August Monetary Policy Report.

**How has Britain benefited from Brexit?** Foreign direct investment In this view, foreign firms see the UK as a gateway to other EU markets, with the UK economy benefiting from its resulting attractiveness as a location for activity. The UK is certainly a major recipient of FDI.

**What caused the UK banking crisis?** This had to do with several factors unique to the UK. The UK had no big manufacturing base, and the economy depended on financial services, real estate, and retail sales for growth. This growth lacked substance as it relied heavily on a risky credit borrowing and lending bubble that finally burst in 2008.

**When did the Bank of England take over monetary policy?** Since we were granted operational independence over monetary policy on 6 May 1997, our responsibilities have grown to include financial stability and regulating firms such as banks and insurers.

**Has UK monetary policy been successful?** The strategy has been successful in terms of keeping UK inflation rates within the targets set by HM Treasury. However, a number of problematic issues are highlighted and discussed. The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) of the independent Bank of England (BoE) operates and conducts monetary policy in the UK.

**How does the Bank of England achieve one of its core purposes that of monetary stability '?** We are the UK's central bank We also work to keep the cost of living stable so your money keeps its purchasing power. One way we do this is by changing the main interest rate in the UK. And we regulate UK banks and other financial firms so you know they are safe and sound.

**What is the new policy of the Bank of England?** The Bank of England expects the inflation rate to rise temporarily to 2¾% in the second half of 2024. However, the Bank forecasts that lower inflationary pressures will lead to the inflation rate falling below the 2% target in 2026. The results of the next scheduled MPC meeting will be announced on 19 September.

**How does the Bank of England control inflation?** One of our aims is to make sure money keeps its value. That means working to keep inflation low and stable. The way we can do that is to use interest rates. We change interest rates by changing the UK's base interest rate (Bank Rate).

**What is the main objective of monetary policy in the UK?** Maintaining monetary stability. Our monetary policy objective is to maintain price stability in the UK. Subject to that, we support the Government's economic policy, including its objectives on growth and employment.

**How does Bank of England control monetary policy?** The primary tool we use is Bank Rate. This is the interest rate we pay on deposits placed with us overnight by eligible firms such as commercial banks. Additionally, when required, we can buy bonds to bring down long-term interest rates on savings and loans through quantitative easing (QE).

**Who controls monetary policy in the UK?** The Bank of England's Monetary Policy Committee is responsible for making decisions about Bank Rate.

**Who decides inflation in the UK?** The Bank of England uses interest rates as a tool to control inflation. Higher interest rates make it more expensive for people to borrow money and makes saving money more attractive.

**How are UK business affected by Brexit?** New analysis released today (Wednesday 15 March, 2023) by the University of Sussex's UK Trade Policy Observatory (UKTPO), reveals that UK businesses are struggling with increased costs, labour and skill issues and supply shortages and issues following the UK's departure from the European Union.

**What impact could Brexit have on the UK economy?** UK real Gross Value Added (GVA)- a measure of the size of the economy- is approximately £140bn less in 2023 than it would have been had the UK opted to remain in the Customs Union and Single Market - a drop of six per cent. The capital's real GVA is more than £30bn less in 2023 under this scenario.

**How is consciousness related to the brain?** The aspects involved in consciousness include the level of consciousness and also the content of consciousness. In the past, consciousness was thought to emanate from the frontal hemispheres of the brain, but current research has found that the content of consciousness mainly originates from the hindbrain.

**What part of the brain has been identified as having a role in consciousness?** Because of the claustrum's extensive connections, the legendary scientist Francis Crick, PhD, of DNA-discovery fame, first postulated in 2005 that the claustrum is the seat of consciousness. In other words, the region of the brain enabling awareness of the world and ourselves.

**Is consciousness outside the brain?** Neuroscience today says consciousness is generated by and localized in the brain because it emerges from brain activity.

**What is the difference between consciousness and the mind?** The mind is the physical structure of the brain, while consciousness is the way that the brain processes information and experiences the world. **Is consciousness a brain process? IS CONSCIOUSNESS A BRAIN PROCESS?** The thesis that consciousness is a process in the brain is put forward as a reasonable scientific hypothesis, not to be dismissed on logical grounds alone.

**Is consciousness linked to memory?** We view the fact that our ability to imagine things in consciousness is constrained by and related to our episodic memory (James, 1890 ; Moulton and Kosslyn, 2009) as another piece of evidence supporting the idea that consciousness evolved as part of episodic memory.

**Where is your conscience located in your brain?** Knight and Vishne lean toward the idea that conscious awareness comes when the prefrontal cortex accesses the sustained activity in the visual cortex. Deouell suspects that consciousness arises from connections among many areas of the brain, the prefrontal cortex being just one of them.

**What brain activity is associated with consciousness?** In the aware mode prefrontal and dorsolateral prefrontal cortices (area 46) are active. In the unaware mode the superior colliculus is active, together with medial and orbital prefrontal cortical sites.

**Is consciousness a quantum effect?** In short, it says that consciousness arises when gravitational instabilities in the fundamental structure of space-time collapse quantum wave functions in tiny structures called microtubules that are found inside neurons – and, in fact, in all complex cells.

**Does our consciousness create reality?** Consciousness, which emerges from the exchange of information via chemical and electrical signals in the brain, allows life to have a notion of awareness of its environment. The brain, the most complex piece of matter in the known universe, creates reality.

**What is the relationship between consciousness and the brain?** Neuroscience. Consciousness is like a rainbow in that it arises from a specific set of circumstances (specialized circuits in the brain). It is an

**Does the brain filter consciousness?** Rather than an explanation for consciousness itself, the resulting framework suggests a way to think of the brain as a filter or tuner that supports, depending on its structure, a particular range of conscious experiences from an ontologically deeper field of aware potentiality.

**Can you have consciousness without memory?** It is possible to have consciousness without episodic memory. Episodic memory can be accessed without conscious retrieval.

**Is consciousness related to intelligence?** Consciousness can be found in various organisms, including humans, insects, and even cells. While intelligence and consciousness can be interdependent, they are separate entities.

**Can consciousness come from matter?** Matter cannot create consciousness.

**What part of the brain is responsible for self-consciousness?** Two areas of the brain that are important in retrieving self-knowledge are the medial prefrontal cortex and the medial posterior parietal cortex. The posterior cingulate cortex, the anterior cingulate cortex, and medial prefrontal cortex are thought to combine to provide humans with the ability to self-reflect.

**How do brain scientists think about consciousness?** Consciousness, this and other research reveals, is not simply a binary—on or off, conscious or unconscious—but instead something that can encompass a continuum of different states that involve different kinds of brain functioning.

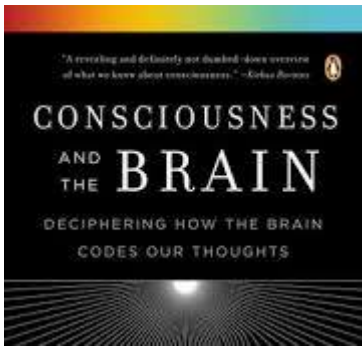

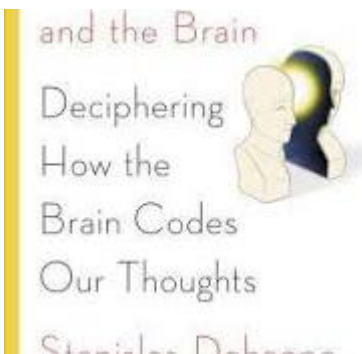

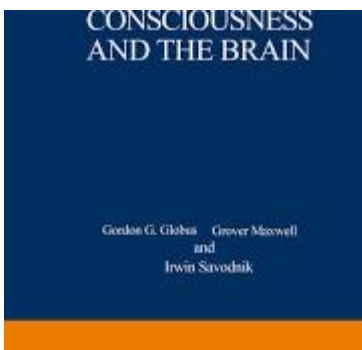
